

## Brief Overview


- Who: Pharmacy student organizations at District IV Colleges of Pharmacy.
- What: Up to \$3,000 of grant money to fund community-based projects demonstrating a collaborative effort between student organizations and community partners, with an aim to advance public health.
- When: The application window is open from August to the assigned due date (based upon District IV meeting schedule), with the awardee announced in December. That awardee agrees to present the results of their project.

- Why: To facilitate community engagement and wellness within District IV, and to provide pharmacy students with experience in applying for and managing a grant funded program.





