

NABP/AACP District IV Grant

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Brief Overview

- **Who:** Pharmacy student organizations at District IV Colleges of Pharmacy.
- **What:** Up to \$3,000 of grant money to fund community-based projects demonstrating a collaborative effort between student organizations and community partners, with an aim to advance public health.
- **When:** The application window is open from August to the assigned due date (based upon District IV meeting schedule), with the awardee announced in December. That awardee agrees to present the results of their project.
- **Where:** At the following NABP District IV Meeting.
- **Why:** To facilitate community engagement and wellness within District IV, and to provide pharmacy students with experience in applying for and managing a grant funded program.

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2023/2024 Grant Program Focus: Women’s Health

- Access to reproductive healthcare for women has become more difficult to obtain for many populations due to changes in practitioner accessibility, legal barriers, and difficult logistics. Pharmacists are increasingly filling these needs.
- Maternal mortality in the United States has consistently risen from 2018 – 2021 and lags behind other developed countries. Review shows that 84% of all pregnancy related deaths in the U.S. are preventable, and half of them occur more than seven days after the patient leaves the hospital.
- Women face differences in disease state incidence and progression for many conditions, but often receive evidence-based care developed largely based on male patient subjects.



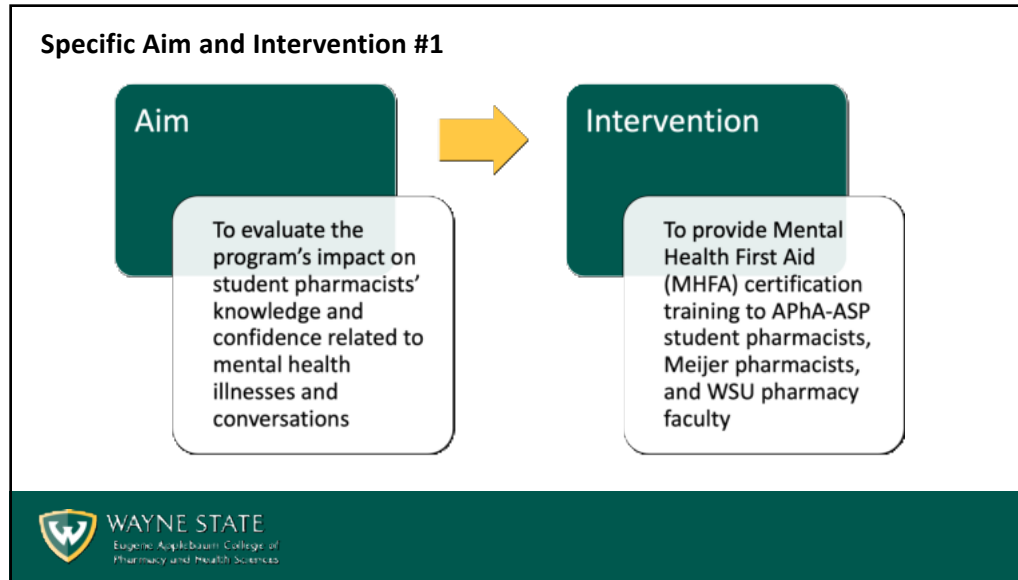

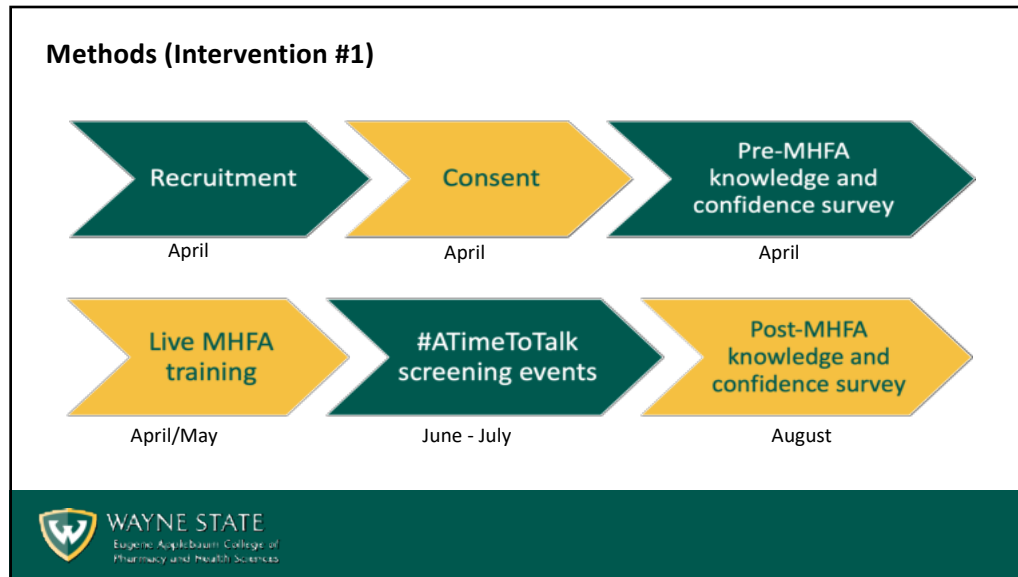

- Contact information
- Baseline knowledge of mental illness
 - 16 statements
 - Agree/disagree
- Baseline confidence when navigating mental health conversations
 - 8 questions
 - 5-point Likert scale (very unconfident – very confident)



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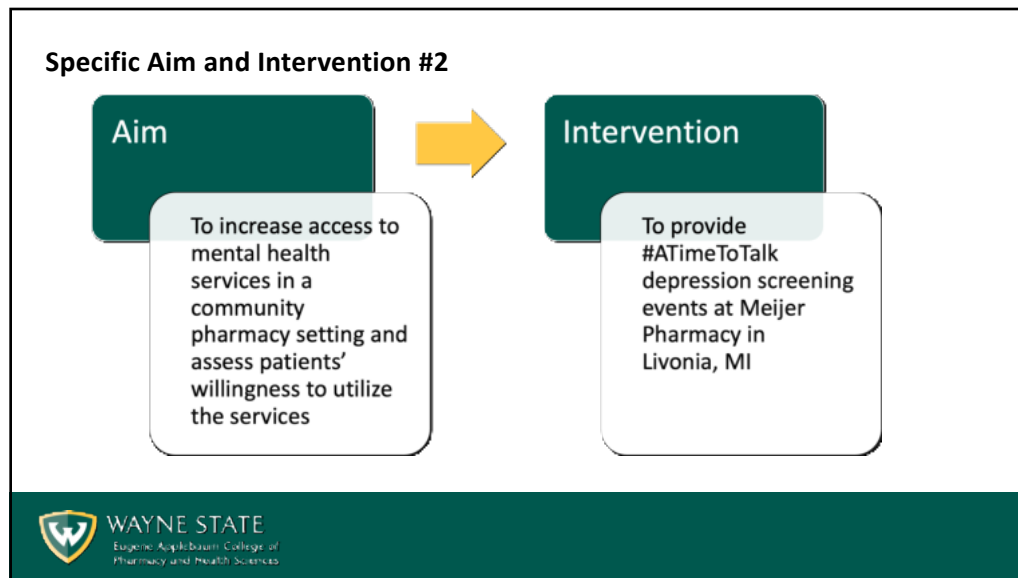

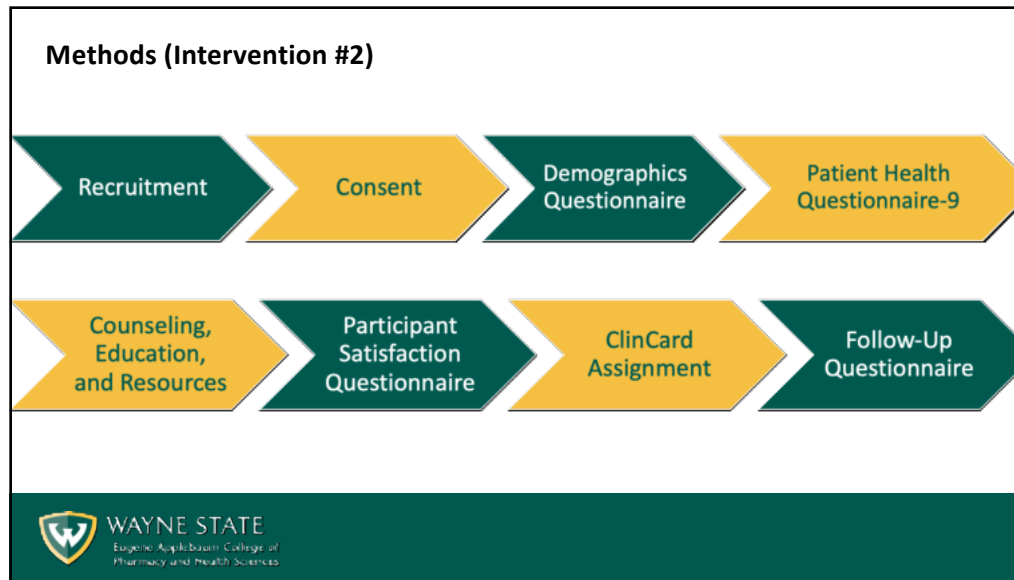
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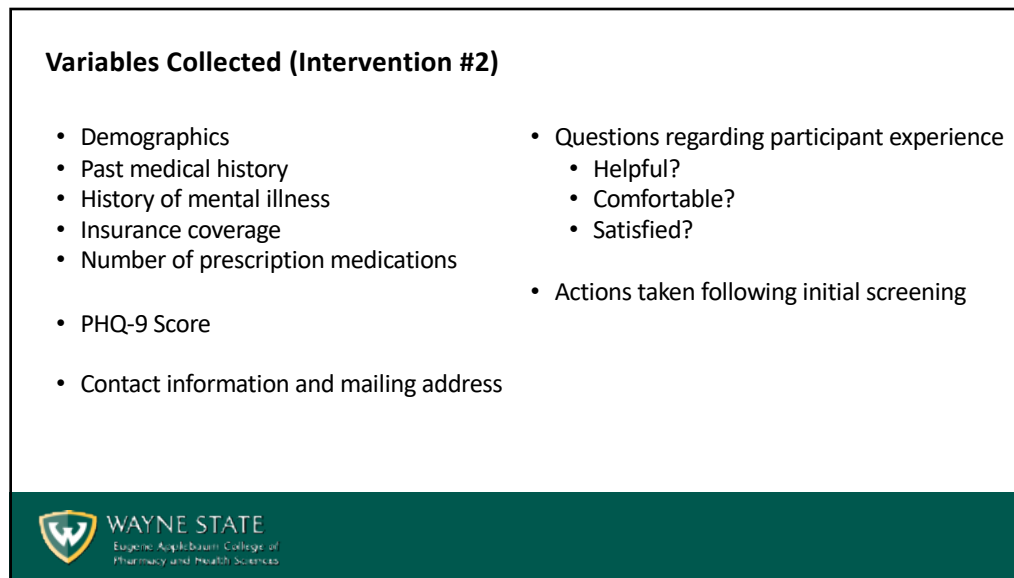
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#ATimeToTalk Screening Event Logistics

Preparation

- Personnel training
- Resource development
- Volunteer scheduling

Implementation

- 12 screening events from June - July
- 4 - 5 hour shifts
- 3 students + 1 preceptor per shift
- Site set up/take down

Evaluation

- Workflow modifications
- Progress monitoring
- Impact reflection

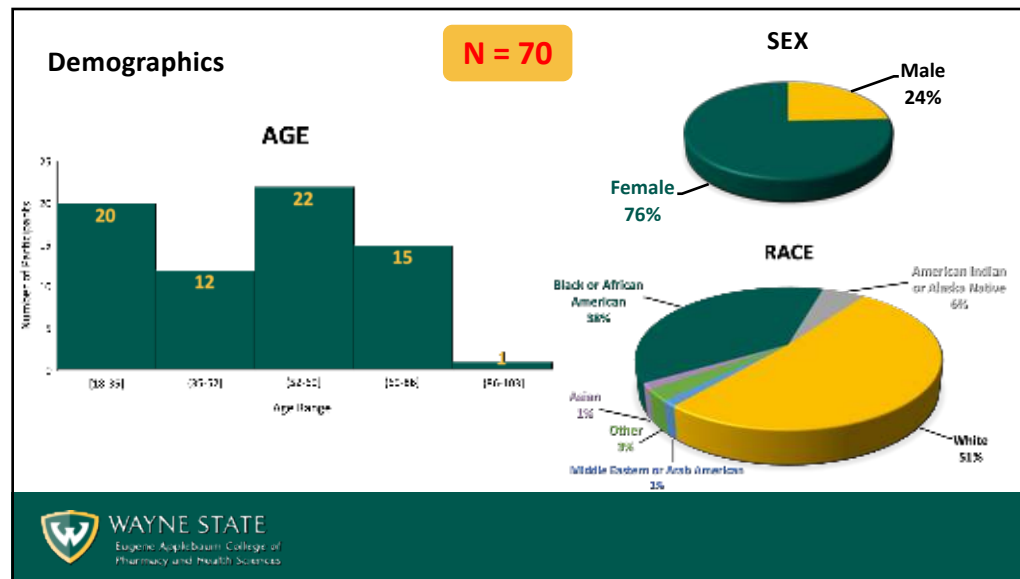




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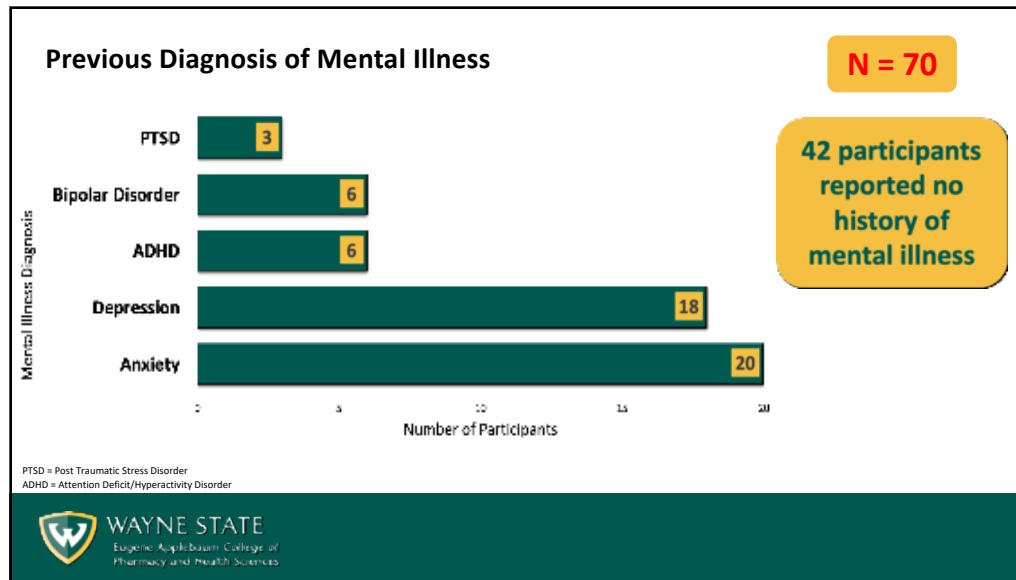
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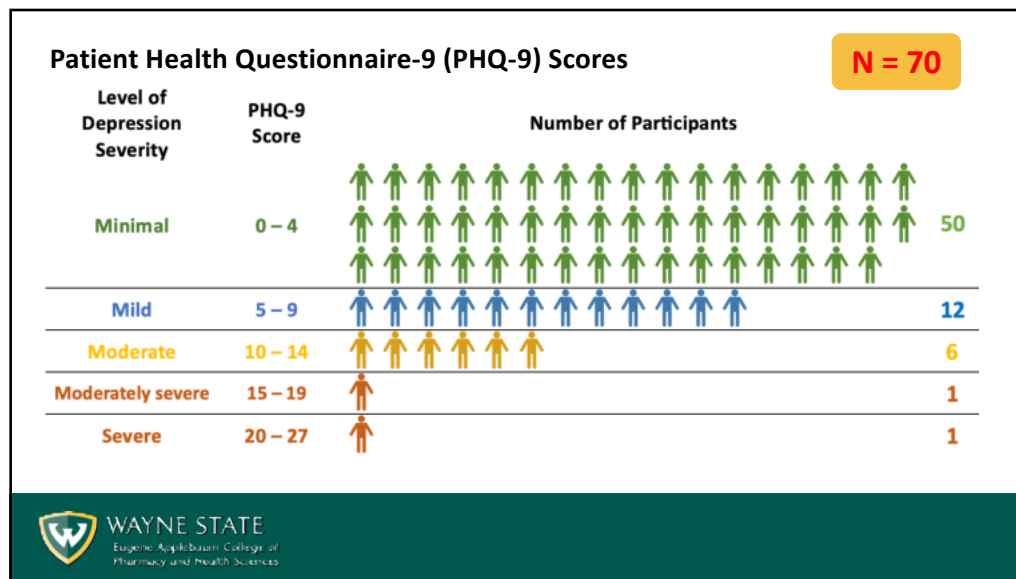
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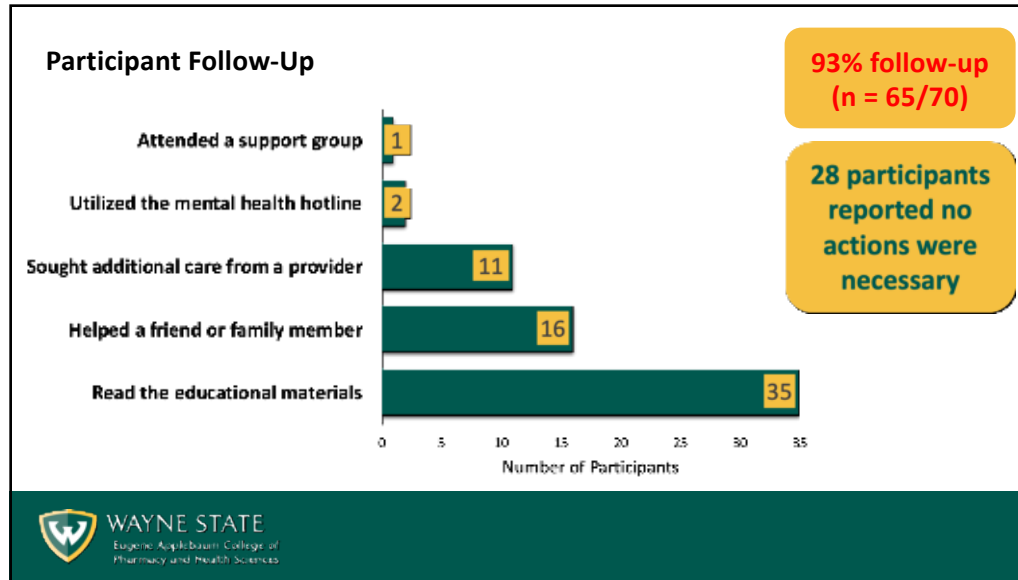
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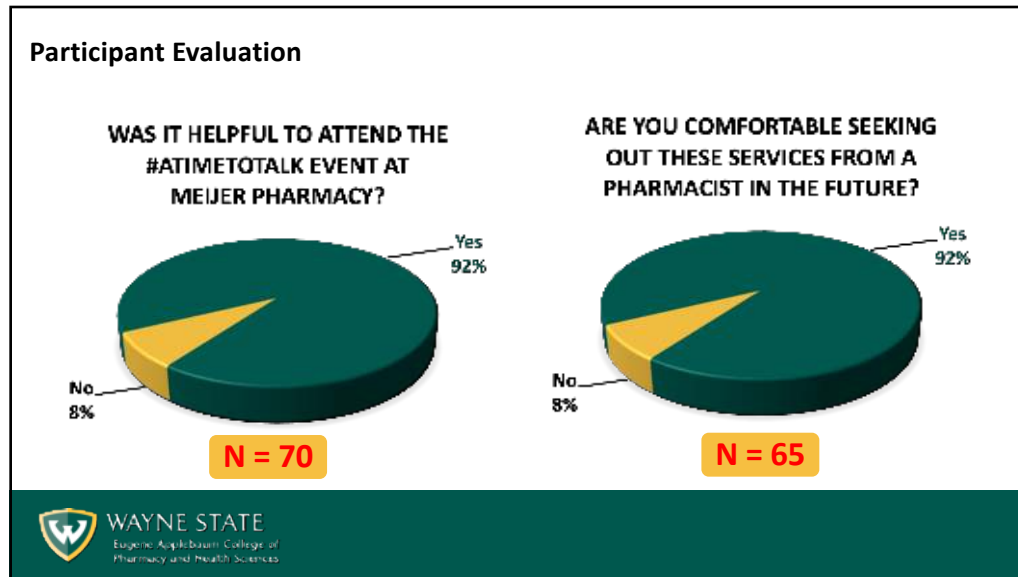
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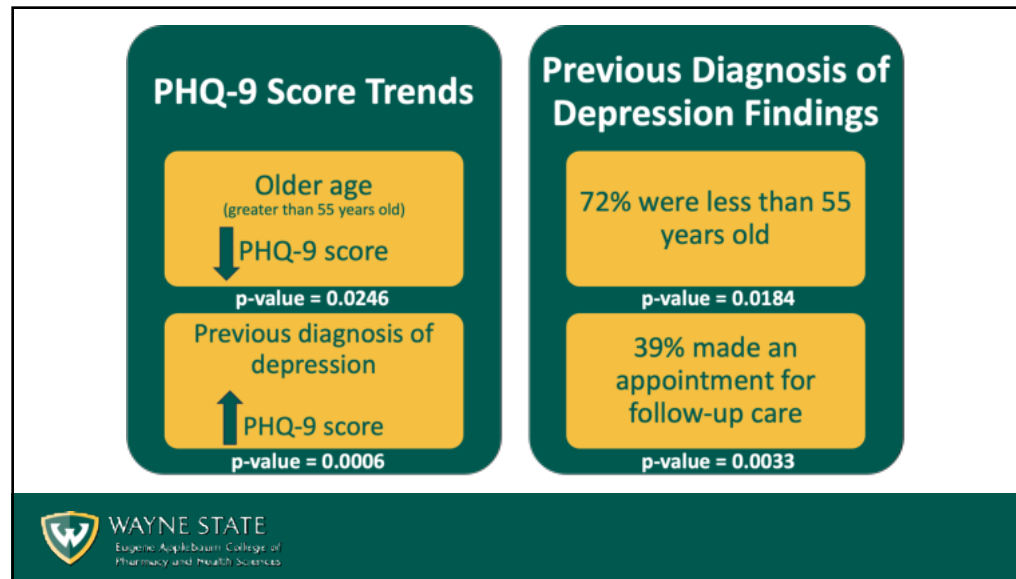
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Conclusions

- #ATimeToTalk depression screening events were successful in recruiting participants and increasing access to mental health services in a community pharmacy setting
- Participants found #ATimeToTalk depression screening events helpful and are comfortable seeking out these services from a pharmacist in the future
- Community pharmacists can play a key role providing mental health care services
